I. DEFINITIONS OF TYPES OF TOURNAMENTS AND TEAMS

(Place corresponding letter in appropriate space on application.)

TYPES OF TOURNAMENTS

- UT UNRESTRICTED TOURNAMENT: A tournament that is open to all Federation affiliated participants. Any tournament that allows international participants must be an Unrestricted Tournament.
- RT RESTRICTED TOURNAMENT: A tournament that is open only to members of US Youth Soccer and its State Associations.

SELECT TEAMS (teams formed by a selection or tryout process):

- S1 generally a team which competes at the highest level of play in a state or region
- S2 generally a team which competes at other than the highest level of play in a state or region
- \$3 generally a team which competes in a local area or state

TOURNAMENT SELECT TEAMS

s4 a team which is put together for the sole purpose of playing in a tournament or other sanctioned non-league competition, whose roster includes select players who are members of one club.

RECREATIONAL TEAMS

RT a team which was formed in a random nature without regard to players' abilities.

US YOUTH SOCCER ODP TEAMS

ODP TEAM: the official US Youth Soccer Olympic Development team of US Youth Soccer, any of its regions, a State Association, an Affiliate, other Organization Member, or any district or geographical subdivisions thereof.

NATIONALTEAMS

NATIONAL TEAM: the official national team of US Soccer or any other member of FIFA.

II. HOSTING RESTRICTED AND UNRESTRICTED TOURNAMENTS AND GAMES

APPLYING TO HOST RESTRICTED TOURNAMENTS OR GAMES

- 1. These procedures apply when hosting ONLY US Youth Soccer State Association or US Youth Soccer Affiliates teams for tournaments or games.
- Applications, agreements to host and other required information must be submitted as provided by the designated approving association or affiliate to include:

Not later than the date established by the State Association or Affiliate for submitting an <u>Application to Host a Tournament or Games</u>, the hosting organization must submit to its State Association or Affiliate and, if any game is to be played in another State Association or Affiliate, to that other State Association or Affiliate, for approval a completed <u>Application to Host a Tournament or Games</u> signed by the designated official of the hosting organization and the following items:

- a) a completed US Youth Soccer <u>Tournament or Games Hosting Agreement</u>, with appropriate supporting documents and information, signed by the president or chief officer or designee of the hosting organization and by the tournament or games director;
- b) a copy of the approved Rules for the Tournament or Games; and
- c) any fees required by the State Association or Affiliate for processing the application. <u>Incomplete applications will be returned and considered as not having ever been submitted.</u>
- 3. The State Association or Affiliate is not required to approve any application not submitted by the deadline established by the State Association or Affiliate. Any application which is not submitted in a timely manner may be subject to late fees if approved. The team must contact its State Association for its specific policies and fees.
- 4. The State Association or US Youth Soccer Affiliate shall make a determination as to whether or not they will sanction the tournament or games in accordance with the policies they have established within their organization for the sanctioning of tournaments or games.

APPLYING TO HOST UNRESTRICTED TOURNAMENTS INCLUDING INTERNATIONAL TEAMS (TEAMS FROM OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES) AND OTHER FEDERATION ORGANIZATION MEMBERS

- 1. The provisions below are in addition to those required as stated above under "Applying to Host Restricted Tournaments or Games". All those provisions so stated above must also be complied with.
- 2. For all tournaments and games involving international teams (teams from outside the United States), the Rules for the Tournament or Games must comply with the following substitution requirements: For matches involving players under 16 years of age, the number of substitutions allowed is as provided by the Rules of the Tournament or Game. For all other matches, the number of substitutions is as agreed to prior to the match and the referee is informed prior to the match of that number. The number agreed to can be as provided in the Rules of the Tournament or Game.
- The completed US Soccer forms Application to Host a Tournament or Games Involving Foreign Teams and Certification Regarding Compliance
 with the Ted Stevens and Olympic Amateur Sports Act must be submitted online to US Soccer through their Application to Host a Tournament or
 Games Involving Foreign Teams.

TOURNAMENT OR GAME RULES – BEHAVIOR: We agree that our tournament or game rules contain provisions ensuring that the behavior of teams, players, coaches, and spectators is appropriately controlled, including specific provisions that—

- Spell out the disciplinary measures to be imposed for the issuance of red and yellow cards or other improper conduct;
- indicate what procedures will be followed regarding protests and appeals;
- indicate that all disciplinary measures imposed by hosting organizations shall be limited to placing restrictions upon an individual's group participation in the tournament/games;
- record the issuance of all red and yellow cards and other matters involving the conduct of a team, its players, coaches, and supporters and also report them immediately to the home State Association and the home club/league of the team; and
- state that the home State Association or member thereof and the home club or league shall, except in the case of referee assault or abuse, have the responsibility for imposing, should circumstances warrant, additional penalties within their respective jurisdictions with regard to any matters arising from the tournament or games.

TOURNAMENT CANCELLATION: We agree that our tournament or game rules shall state what refunds, if any, shall be made to participating teams if all or a portion of the tournament or games is cancelled by the hosting organization for any reason.

POST TOURNAMENT OR GAMES REPORT: We agree that we shall file any required Post Tournament or Games Report with the State Association or Affiliate granting us permission to host this tournament or games within 30 days after the conclusion of the tournament or games. We understand that failure to file the report may preclude the tournament/games host from receiving approval for any tournament/games for the following seasonal years until the report is filed. The Post Tournament or Games Report shall include the following information:

- · the number of teams participating in each age group (boys and girls);
- · if a champion is determined, the name of the champion for each group;
- the number of teams from each State Association, Affiliate, other Organization Member, or foreign country;
- if "Sportsmanship Awards" are given, the criteria for the award and to whom awards were given;
- · the number of fields used for the tournament/games;
- the name of the sponsor, if any; and
- the names and teams of all players issued red and yellow cards, and details of any other matters involving the improper or unsporting conduct of a team, its players, coaches or supporters. NOTE: Any incident of referee assault or referee abuse by a player, coach, manager, club official, or game official must be reported to the alleged offender's home State Association, or member thereof immediately, but in no event later than 48 hours after an incident of referee assault or abuse..

2024 4v4 Tournament

Rules of Competition

For all competition in this tournament, FIFA Laws of the Game will be used. The following Rules of Competition are also adopted:

- 1. For U9, U10, U11 and U12 games a #4 ball will be used. For all other age groups, a #5 ball will be used.
- 2. All games will be 2 twelve-minute halves. Half time for all games is two minutes.
- 3. Age groups in this tournament will <u>be based on the calendar year of birth of the oldest player on the team in conformance with US Soccer's birth year registration initiative</u>. A team will be eligible for an age group if every player on the team was born on or after January 1 of the year as shown in the chart below. Any team registering in the wrong age group may not be permitted to participate in that age group and will forfeit their tournament entry fee. No overage players are permitted.

- 4. Each team may roster up to 8 players for the tournament. All players must be registered with a member of their national soccer association, which is affiliated, directly or indirectly, with FIFA. In the United States, this is the United States Soccer Federation (USSF). Members of USSF include US Club Soccer (USCS), US Youth Soccer (USYSA), American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO), and Soccer Association for Youth (SAY). Proof of such registration shall be player identification cards (cards must have player's picture and be laminated) issued by the registering organization which must be presented at check-in. Players must be registered for either the 2024/2025 or 2023/2024 seasons. There cannot be a mixture of player cards from different affiliations. (Every player on the team must have the same type of player card. A team cannot mix USYSA cards with US Club cards or any of the above listed affiliations. No valid player card, no play.
- 5. A team may have any number of guest players, but all of them must provide evidence of registration at check in. The decision of the tournament director(s) on acceptable proof of registration and/or age is final. Rosters, player cards, and travel papers (if required) must be presented at check in. Copies of travel papers will be given to our state association.
- 6. Teams may not add to their roster after the team's first game of the tournament. Any team using a player not listed on their tournament roster will forfeit that game. Players may not be rostered on more than one team in this tournament.
- 7. Each team must have a minimum of three players on the field. If a team does not have at least three players ready at the scheduled kickoff time ("ready" means in uniform, checked in with the referee and on the field of play), they will be allowed three minutes to assemble three players. A team which does not have three players ready within three minutes after scheduled kickoff time, or which falls below three players on the field at any time during the game, will forfeit the game. The tournament director may prohibit a team that has forfeited a game from further participation in the tournament.
- 8. Only USSF registered referees will be used.
- 9. The referee will inspect player equipment before the game. Players may not wear anything which is considered by the referee to be dangerous to the player, teammates or opposing players. Each team must present its tournament certified roster, including each player's full name and shirt number, as well as the full name of all coaches and other bench personnel, to the referee before the contest.

- 10. Each team must wear shirts of the same color, which are different from the opposing team. If, in the opinion of the referee, there is a conflict of colors, the designated home team must change. All shirts, including alternates, must be numbered with no duplications. Players, with unnumbered shirts will not be permitted to play. Players may not change shirts during a game except with the permission of the referee.
- 11. Either team may substitute on the fly. There will be no limit on the number of times a player may reenter the game.
- 12. Four players on the field, no goalkeepers.
- No throw-ins all restarts will be kick-in with defending players a minimum of 3 yards away.
- 14. No off sides.
- 15. No play in the "no-play zone" which will be an arc in front of each goal. Defensive player touches ball in zone = automatic goal. Offensive player touches ball in zone = goal kick. If ball stops in zone = goal kick.
- 16. No slide tackling.
- 17. All dead ball kicks are indirect with the exception of a penalty kick.
- 18. All teams must have matching light and dark uniforms.
- 19. All coaches and other bench personnel must remain within the technical area during the game. Although the technical area may not be marked, this is understood to extend no more than five yards beyond the benches in either direction and no closer than three yards to the field. Coaching during the game is limited to one person giving directions to their own team. No mechanical or electronic devices may be used. Team head coaches are also responsible for the conduct of their players, bench personnel and spectators.
- 20. Any coach receiving a send-off (red card) must leave the site.
- 21. Any player, coach or bench personnel sent off (red card) may not participate in the team's next game of the tournament. Any player, coach or bench personnel sent off for violent conduct may not participate in any further game of the tournament and will be referred to their state or national association for further sanctions. If a player, coach or bench personnel participates in any game for which they are suspended, his or her team shall forfeit that game and the player or coach may not participate in an additional game of the tournament. A coach who is suspended may not be present at any game for which they are suspended.
- 22. In tied games designated by the tournament as requiring a winner, kicks from the penalty mark (penalty mark is ½ line), as provided in the Laws of the Game, will be taken at the end of regular time.
- 23. In round robin play, a team receives six points for a win, 3 points for a tie, 1 point for a shutout and one point for each goal (maximum 3 points.) If two or more teams are tied on points after round robin play, the following tie-breakers will be used:
 - 1. Head to head play (only if two teams are tied).
 - Best total goal differential (up to + or three goals per game).
 - 3. Fewest yellow and red card points received. A yellow card is one point and a red card is two points. If a player receives a red card for having received a second yellow card, the team receives two points.
 - 4. Fewest goals allowed.
 - 5. Coin toss conducted by tournament director(s). Team representatives may or may not be present at option of the tournament director(s).

If multiple teams are tied, these tiebreakers will be used to eliminate teams at each step, if possible. If more than one team remains tied, the tiebreakers will then be reapplied, starting with #1. (For example, if teams A, B and C are tied on points, tiebreaker #1 does not apply. If tie-breaker #2 sees teams A and B tied on goal differential, with a better goal differential than team C, team C is eliminated. The next tiebreaker to be applied is head to head play between teams A and B.)

All forfeited games will be treated as a 3-0 win for the non-forfeiting team, unless the game was already played and the non-forfeiting team won by a greater margin.

- 24. All referee judgments and decisions are final. There will be no appeals.
- 25. Red Cards Any coach or bench personnel dismissed from a game must leave the site; and may not participate in the team's next game. Any player or substitute sent off (red card) will receive a minimum 1 game suspension. All violent conduct reports will be reviewed by the Tournament Director and Referee Coordinator to determine the number of game suspensions, all decisions will be final. If a player, coach or bench personnel participates in any game for which they are suspended, his or her team shall forfeit that game and the player or coach may not participate in any additional game of the tournament.
- 26. Possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages at any game site by players, coaches or spectators is prohibited. Smoking of any kind is also prohibited on any THPRD field.
- 27. The tournament director(s) have the authority to modify or waive these rules in unusual circumstances for any games that have not yet begun. (For example, in the event of extremely hot weather, they may shorten or otherwise modify the games.) Any modification, waiver, or failure to enforce any of these rules of competition does not require the granting of further modification, waiver or lack of enforcement. These are the official rules of competition and they supersede any other summary or description of the rules, written or verbal.
- 28. Refunds will not be granted for any reason once the tournament draw is posted. Refunds may be granted at the discretion of the tournament director prior to that.
- 29. Safety: A player who demonstrates signs of concussion as a result of an observed or suspected blow to the head or body must leave the field and may not return to play in that match. Referees will include in their match report information about any player required to leave the field because of a suspected concussion. A player who has been removed from a game by a referee because of a suspected concussion is ineligible to play until the league director has received a copy of a medical release signed by a health care professional that authorizes an unrestricted return to competition.
- 30. Team Check-In and Credentials. Teams must check-in at least 60 minutes prior to the first match. Teams will be notified of the time and location of check-in.
 - Player Card Verification: All participating players and coaches shall present a player card issued by a
 USSF member organization (US Club Soccer, US Youth Soccer Association, American Youth Soccer
 Organization or Soccer Association for Youth). All player cards must have the player's picture and be
 laminated. Players may be registered for the 2024/2025 or 2023/2024 soccer years. Each team must
 present the same type of player card issued from the same association. For example, a team cannot
 mix USYSA cards with US Club Soccer Cards or any of the above-listed affiliations. No valid pass card
 = no play. The player cards will be verified and checked against the team roster at tournament check-in.
 - Travel Papers: Teams travelling as USYSA teams from USYSA region IV do not need travel papers.
 Teams travelling as USYSA teams from USYSA regions I, II and III must present travel papers at check-in. Copies of travel papers will be given to our state association. Teams travelling as US Club teams do not need travel papers.
 - Roster Verification: At check-in, teams must present one copy of their official roster. Teams using US
 Club Soccer cards must present an official US Club Soccer roster. Teams using USYSA cards must
 present an official roster generated from their state USYSA association. Rosters must include player's
 full name, date of birth and jersey number, as well as the full name of all coaches and other bench
 personnel. Verification of the roster will consist of checking player cards against the official roster.
- 31. **SPECIAL HEADER RULE:** There is no heading for U12 and under. An indirect free kick will result from the spot that the ball was headed.

OYSA Tournament Sanctioning

OYSA will sanction tournaments hosted by OYSA member clubs where the participating teams are members of the USSF or are from outside the United States and the USSF also sanctions the tournament.

The following fees apply to all applications to Oregon Youth Soccer Association for sanctioned tournaments.

Sanctioning Fees:

- Tournaments with full-sided matches (11v11) \$5.00 / team
- Tournaments with small-sided matches (3v3, 5v5, etc, including indoor, futsal, and street soccer) - \$2.50 / team
- Tournaments with both full-sided and small-sided matches \$5.00 / team playing full-sided plus \$2.50 / team playing small-sided
- [NOTE: All teams registered at age U12 or younger must play in the small-sided playing format specified by the U. S. Soccer Federation Player Development Initiative (PDI). A tournament may specify a smaller number of players per team (e.g., 3v3 or 6v6) than the PDI, but not more.]

Payment of Fees:

A \$250 non-refundable deposit must accompany the application for sanctioning. The \$250 deposit will be applied to the amount due as shown in the post-tournament report.

The post-tournament report includes a calculation of the total sanctioning fee based on the total number of teams that participated in the tournament in each age group and how many teams played small-sided games. No refund will be issued when the calculated fee is less than the deposit.

The post-tournament report and fee payment is due not later than 30 days following the completion of the tournament. A late fee of \$200 will be added to the amount due for any post-tournament report received in the OYSA office more than 40 days after the last day of the tournament.

- Copy of Your Tournament Rules: A copy of your tournament rules must be submitted WITH your application. Your rules must include the following information:
 - o Valid Member Passes (player cards) are required for all players participating. These passes must be checked at credential check in and/or game site.
 - o Playing formats for all age groups must match the USSF PDI requirements for small sided games (except for tournaments in which the format uses a smaller number of players for all ages, e.g. 3v3, 6v6, etc.)
 - Statement of your refund policy.
 - o What is your appeals process?
 - o Will there be a trainer on site?
- Oregon Youth Soccer Web Information Sheet: This information will appear on the OYSA website.
- Dual Sanction Statement: Completed and signed.

<u>Post Tournament Report:</u> Is not submitted with your application. The report must be completed and sent into the OYSA office within 30 days after conclusion of the tournament or games. You should review the report to be sure that you collect all of the information you will need to submit with that report.
